## PLUS/MINUS GRADING SYSTEM

Courses taken in the Fay Jones School (ARCH, LARC, and IDES) are graded according to the following scale:

A = 4.0	C = 2.0
A- = 3.67	C- = 1.67
B+ = 3.33	D+ = 1.33
B = 3.0	D = 1.0
B- = 2.67	D- = 0.67
C+ = 2.33	F = 0

Most other courses at the University of Arkansas are graded on a 5-step system:

A = 4; B = 3; C = 2; D = 1; F = 0
